ACADEMIC PRIZES

Offered to current students

These prizes are awarded at the Collegiate Dinners which begin each semester. They are presented to students based on their academic results from the previous semester:

Semester 1 prizes:

The Father C.P. Finn Prize (named for the founding Rector of the College, 1950-51) is donated by the Aquinas College Foundation. It is presented to the top first year student from the previous year.

The Brother Austin Stephens Prize is donated by the Marist Brothers in recognition of Brother Austin who was an early member of the Aquinas College Council and made a significant contribution to Catholic education in South Australia. It is awarded to the top second-year student from the previous year.

The Kennedy Family Prize is donated by five former Aquinians of the extended Kennedy family. It is awarded to the top senior student from the previous year.

The Aquinas Medal and the Bessie Greenland Scholarship are awarded to the Dux of the College from the previous year.

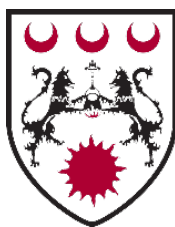

<p><i>Playford Trust Third Year Undergraduate Scholarships</i></p>	<p>With the generous support of Nyrstar, the Playford Trust offers up to four two-year scholarships to students commencing their third year of undergraduate studies in 2020 in the areas of chemical, mechanical or electrical engineering at one of South Australia's three universities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The scholarships are valued at \$10,000 per year, for two years. • The scholarship involves a paid eight to twelve week work placement at Nyrstar's Port Pirie Smelter over the summer vacation. Students receiving a two year scholarship will undertake a placement in the vacation before their third-year and before their fourth-year studies commence. • Scholarship holders will be paid generously for each work placement but are expected to meet their own living expenses while on their eight-week placement. • The paid work placement will provide the scholarship holder with the opportunity to develop skills and enhance their industry participation. They will undertake a number of technical projects to solve real problems and apply university knowledge in an industrial setting. Working closely with the senior plant metallurgist or senior engineer to properly understand and identify the problem, they will undertake analysis of the problem, develop/design and implement solutions. • At the end of their scholarship and studies, the scholarship holder may be offered a place in Nyrstar's graduate program at Port Pirie. <p>Please apply directly to the Playford Trust by clicking here</p>
<p><i>Playford Trust Regional Science & Engineering</i></p>	<p>The Playford Trust seeks to support outstanding students from regional South Australia who intend to enrol as undergraduates to study science, engineering, mathematics or technology subjects at one of the State's three universities. Six awards of \$4000 each are available for students entering the first year of their university course. These special scholarships will be awarded to promising students who will need to overcome the practical and financial disadvantages associated with living away from their home and community. The funds are intended to help the recipients cover the additional expenses associated with living and studying in Adelaide and being removed from the usual level of family support. <p>Adelaide Access Scholarships</p>	<p>The University of Adelaide will award a number of scholarships for students commencing undergraduate programs in 2020 who have not commenced a post-secondary program of study previously (university or VET). Recipients of the Adelaide Access Scholarship will receive \$2,500 per annum, paid in two (2) instalments in April and September for the duration of their studies, up to a maximum of four (4) years. <p>Adelaide University Sport</p>	<p>This Scholarship has been established by the Adelaide University Sports Association (“the Sports Association”) which aims to provide and promote the best possible sport and recreation environment for the University Community. Catering for elite athletes through to social players, the Sports Association offers students a range of recreational activities and access to sporting facilities and clubs. The Scholarship is to benefit two students per year who are undertaking an Undergraduate or Honours program of study at the University of Adelaide and who have been identified by the University as members of the Sports Association. The scholarship is available for one year.</p> <p>The Scholarship is open to students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia and undertaking a program of study at the University of Adelaide. Students should be an active financial member of an Adelaide University Sporting Club and undertaking study on a full-time basis.</p> <p>Students must be able to demonstrate details of sporting prowess and contributions to Sporting Club development and provide supporting documentary evidence at the time of application, e.g. details of club involvement, sporting representation and/or achievement, letter of recommendation from the Sporting Club, or other details of sporting contributions to their chosen University Club sport. <p>Augustus Short Scholarship</p>	<p>The University of Adelaide pioneer Dr Augustus Short believed that tertiary education should be accessible to all students of high academic merit, regardless of birth or wealth.</p> <p>Thanks to the generous support of donors, the Augustus Short Scholarships are available to students of high academic merit who come from rural or remote areas, challenging financial circumstances or another disadvantage.</p> <p>Up to three scholarships will be awarded to students commencing undergraduate programs in 2021. <p>Equal Access Grant</p>	<p>The Adelaide University Union (AUU) will again offer Equal Access Grants in 2020 to assist financially disadvantaged students commencing studies at the University of Adelaide.</p> <p>Priority is given to students starting their first year of university study. It is only in extremely rare circumstances that other students would be eligible for this grant. It is intended that the grants will help buy books, stationery and other basic resources or help with other essential costs approved by the scheme's administrators.</p> <p>The principal criterion will be financial need. Applicants should bring appropriate documentation with them to their interview (e.g. Centrelink health-care card, proof of Centrelink income). The grants are one-off payments and range from \$200-\$500, depending on a student's circumstances, the number of applicants, and availability of funds. For further information click here</p>
<p>Rotary Club of Barossa Valley Foundation Scholarship</p>	<p>The Rotary Club of Barossa Valley Foundation Scholarship has been established by the Rotary Club of Barossa Valley to support a student from the Barossa/Eden Valley region of South Australia who is commencing any undergraduate program of study at the University of Adelaide. Applicants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia undertaking study as a Commonwealth supported student and must remain enrolled on a full time basis in the program for which the Scholarship was approved.</p> <p>Selection of the successful candidate will be made according to academic merit, financial need and with reference to applicant's written statement regarding their school activities and responsibilities and/or community involvement. <i>Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships</i>	The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships are intended to improve access to and completion of tertiary education courses for students from a regional or remote area in Australia. The Program will support up to 1200 undergraduate, postgraduate and Vocational Education and Training (VET) students to undertake a tertiary course, open to all fields of study the scholarships are for Certificate IV to PhD courses. <p>The Pearce Family Grant</p>	<p>The Pearce family have made available transition grants to assist rural students of South Australia in the transition to tertiary education. The grants are available to rural students who have graduated from high school in the last two years and are enrolling at university for the first time. Applicants must be commencing a full-time undergraduate degree program in Education at the University of South Australia and be able to demonstrate financial disadvantage. <p>Wyndham Richardson Accommodation Scholarships</p>	<p>Originally established in 1983 the Wyndham Richardson Accommodation Scholarships awards scholarships, bursaries and prizes based on merit or reasons of equity to promote a recipient's tertiary education. These are available to Australian Citizens or Australian Permanent Residents from any State or Territory studying in a tertiary institution.
